A team from P6/7 went to BP Headquarters in Dyce to showcase their class work on carbon capture and storage. At the event they had STEM challenges, listened to career talks and had to present their learning on carbon capture to a team of experts. We are delighted to share that they came second place in the event, out of 16 schools from across Aberdeen city and Aberdeenshire (secondary and primary schools).



Iona - I liked all the STEM challenges. My favourite was the ASCO challenge where we had to make a boat and offload the containers.

Jamie - I enjoyed being at the event and seeing what everyone else had done.
