The elephant patterns worked really well as the children finished off learning about patterns. There were some spotty, stripy and colourful patterns and they made a display on the wall for everyone to see.



Now the children have begun investigating mini beasts. They have been using the magnifying glasses to look at them in more detail, looking at wings, legs and antennas. They have been on the lookout for minibeasts and have already spotted spiders, woodlice, beetles and caterpillars!



The story of the month is Super Worm by Julia Donaldson which as well as having great rhyming words uses mathematical language so we have started to discuss further full/empty, long/short, wide/narrow, heavy/light and holds more/holds less.

The children have been exploring the water tray pouring the water to make their cups full or empty.



Out in the garden they had great fun filling and emptying their buckets with mud. While out on the bikes, they made wide and narrow roads with the chalk for others to follow.



Some of the children have planted seeds for flowers and we have talked about how to look after plants. We are also very excited to have a delivery this week of some caterpillars who we will watch over as they begin to grow and we will learn about lifecycles.
